Naming photos for RCC Competition

Naming photos (.jpg files) for RCC Competition

The computer program we use to show and rate photos requires that photos be named in a specific way. To be clear, you may give your image any title you want (as long as it is less than 30 characters). However, the .jpg file you send to <u>rossmoorlw@gmail.com</u> must be formatted as illustrated in the examples below.

Category for competition (General, Intermediate, or Advanced), **your name**, and **short title** (not over 30 characters and spaces and no punctuation). Images should be in .jpg format. For example...

Intermediate, Bob Schultz, Arlington House.jpg

Advanced, Stu Lillard, My Virginia Plantation.jpg

General, Jane Doe, title of photo.jpg (descriptive name, less than 30 characters)

Be sure to attach your three entries to the email and then press SEND. The system should let you know that the entries have been received.

Do not use other punctuation marks, other than commas. Do not use special characters (like \$, or #, or @) in the file (image) name. All digitals must be submitted as jpg.

The projector we use at the competition projects images at 1920 x 1080 pixel resolution. This is a 16:9 aspect ratio. Images will be shown correctly if they are sized to no more than 1920 pixels on the horizontal axis, and no more than 1080 pixels on the vertical axis they can be smaller than the given dimensions on an axis, for example 1350 x 1080 pixels for a 4:5 (or 8:10) aspect ratio.
